## Elmcrest Art Fair returns to Ramsey

After the success of last year's inaugural art fair at Elmcrest Park in Ramsey, a second event is planned for Sunday, July 15.

The Elmcrest Art Fair is put on jointly by the city of Ramsey, Rumriver Art Center and Artists del Norte.

"We're stoked. We have over 40 artists already registered," Ramsey Parks Superintendent Mark Riverblood said early this week.

Artists will display their work, much of it for sale, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., during which time visitors are free to mingle.

Attendees will have the opportunity to become artists themselves with three free introductory art classes at 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. in the Park Community Building.

Artist demonstrations are set to occur at noon and 2 p.m. in the same location.

Food trucks will offer fare for hungry fairgoers, and musicians will provide a soundtrack for the event.

"It will just be a really fun event to get outside, see some art (and) eat some good food," said Cela Schmit, parks intern helping coordinate the event. "It's free, so why not."
